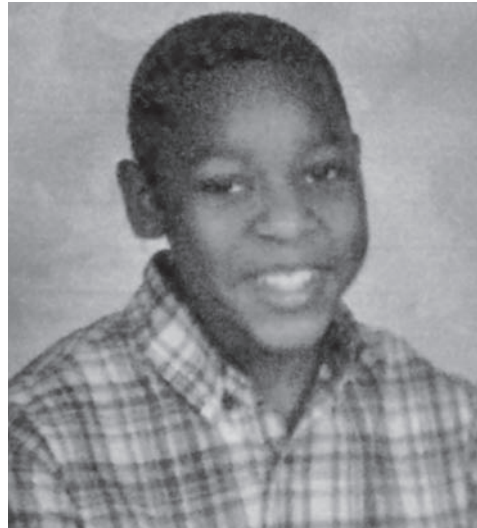

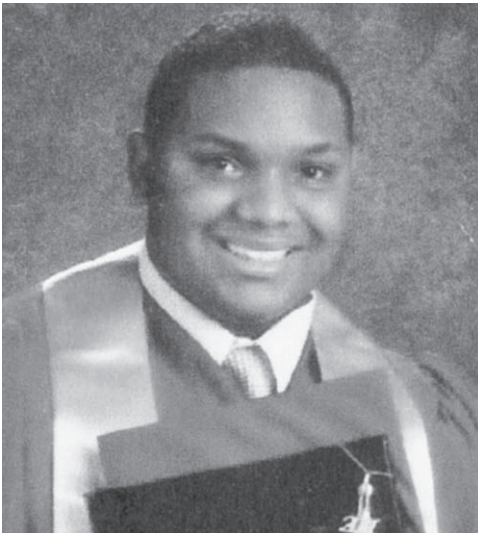
"I liked that we went to the museums as a group and we got to see the Capitol and White House. I also liked that the youth got to do things together."—Escada Horton

He is the son of Ms. Sonya Bradley, brother of DeShawna Bradley and grandson of Mrs. Mary Bradley.

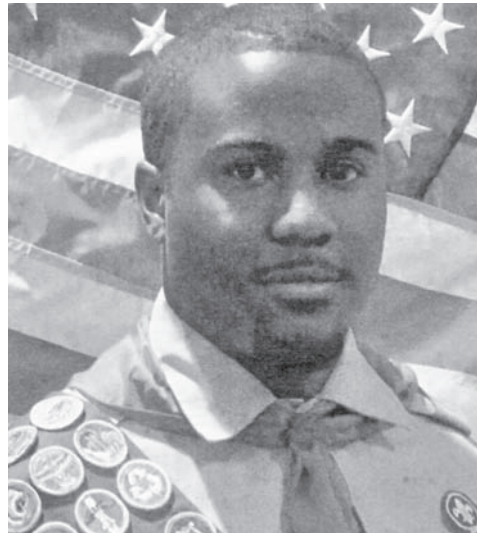

Rev. Horton currently serves on the personnel staff as the Pastor's liaison in her role as Minister of Small Groups.
