Rev. Artis Hairston Smith Comes Back To New Bethel

Rev. Artis Hairston Smith started attending New Bethel as a child when her father, the Rev. Richard L. Hairston, was an Associate Minister under the late Jerry Gilmore. After her father passed, she was baptized by Dr. Jerry Drayton and shortly thereafter attended her mother's home church. She recently returned to New Bethel which she identifies as "her family's church." She said that the Lord led her back to New Bethel.

She came back to New Bethel after having served as an Associate Minister at St. Stephen Missionary Baptist Church where she was licensed to preach the Gospel in November 1997 and ordained to the work of the Gospel Ministry in December 2001. At St. Stephen, her involvement in church ministries included Sunday School Teacher, New Members Orientation, Resource Ministry Instructor, Prison Ministry, Evangelism Committee, Board of Christian Education and many others. She served as an Adult Instructor for the Rowan Congress of Christian Education.

Rev. Smith was the Founder and Pastor of New Century Missionary Baptist church which was established in November 2002 with about 30 members. After a series of illnesses, she resigned her pastorate at New Century in January 2007. The Holy Spirit directed her to New Bethel Baptist Church to be used according to God's will and way.

Rev. Smith holds an Associate Degree in Business Management from WinSalem Business College. She has attended Winston-Salem State University, Salem College, Forsyth Technical Institute, Vintage Bible College and has audited

Rev. Gerald Lamont Thomas, Ph.D. Is Revival Preacher

Rev. Gerald Lamont Thomas, Ph.D., Pastor of Shiloh Baptist Church in Plainfield, New Jersey will conduct the 2007 Fall Revival which begins on Tuesday, September 18, 2007. The services will be held on three consecutive nights ending on September 20.

A native of Youngstown, Ohio, Dr. Thomas earned both Ph.D. and M. Divinity from Southern University in Louisville, Kentucky. He received a B.A. in Economics from Howard University in Washington, D.C. and is the former Professor of Preaching at Eastern Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. He has served as Pastor of several churches in Kentucky and Pennsylvania. In July 2006 he became the President of the New Jersey Progressive National Baptist Convention, Inc. and was recently appointed by the National President of that body to Chair a newly formed National Task Force on Social Justice for Public and Social Policy.

In March of 2005, the Shiloh Baptist Church Family held its first worship service in its new \$13.2 million state of the art edifice which provides seating 1100 people and under Dr. Thomas' leadership, the TEAMS Charter School which serves 180 students in grades K-8 opened in September of that year. He is Founder and President of Shiloh's faith-based community development Corporation and numerous other church and civic operations and activities. He is also a published author.

Visiting choirs will render music for the services each night.

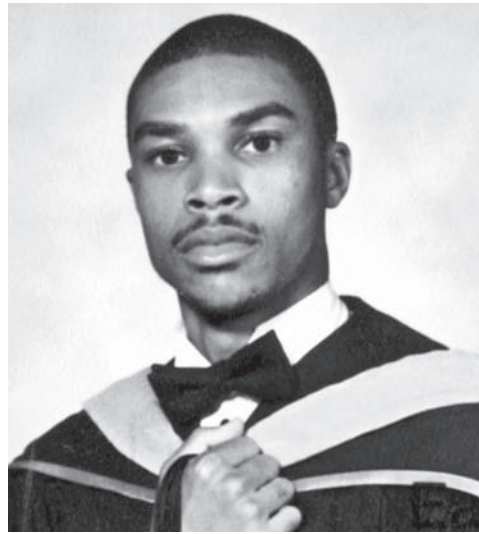
